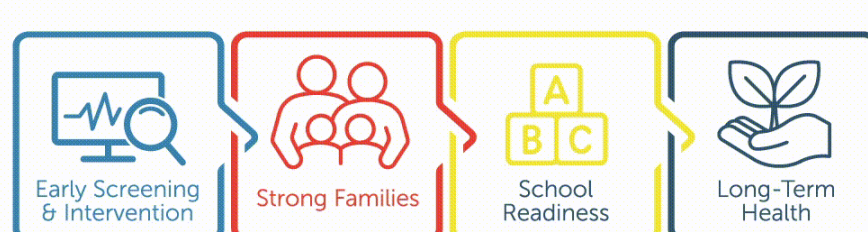


## New Resources to Help Health Centers Strengthen Support For Families

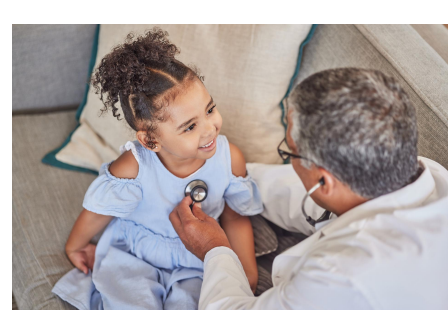


- Our [Change Package for Community Health Centers: Integrating the Early Childhood Development Continuum of Care](#) is a practical guide to help health centers improve how they support young children's development. It offers clear ideas and sample tools that centers and other pediatric practices can try out and implement to improve care.
- These [new summary resources](#) capture key strategies and ideas from a six-month learning network series with health centers focused on improving developmental outcomes for children ages 0-5. Each session covered practical ways to engage and support families, build leadership, use consistent screening processes and share other ideas that pediatric care teams can use in their work.

## Our Impact: Improving Children's Health and Family Well-being



Since 2022, our Center has worked with teams in 42 states, territories, Tribal Nations and communities to strengthen the systems that support young children and families.



Through the Transforming Pediatrics for Early Childhood (TPEC) program, eight Resource Hubs have supported 51 pediatric practices in delivering 27,000 developmental screenings and serving 68,000 families.

Together, these efforts turn evidence into action – helping families receive the services they need, when they need them.
